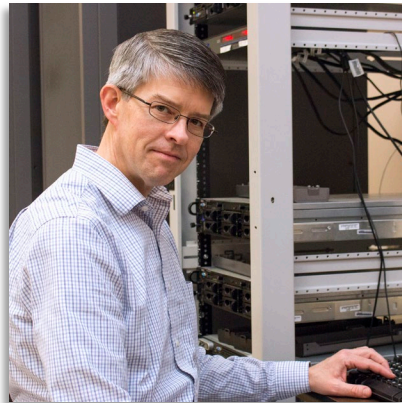

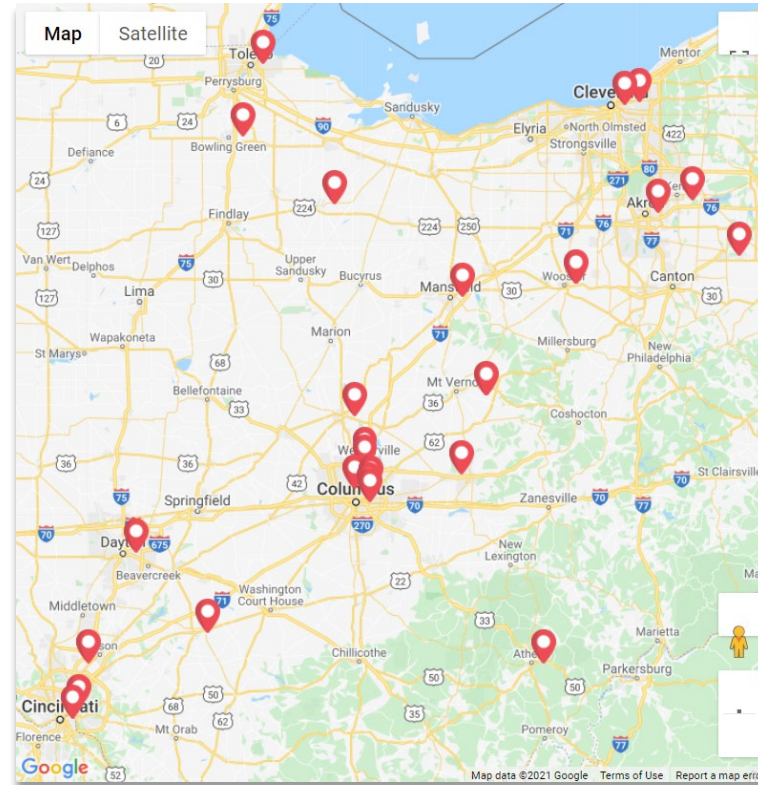

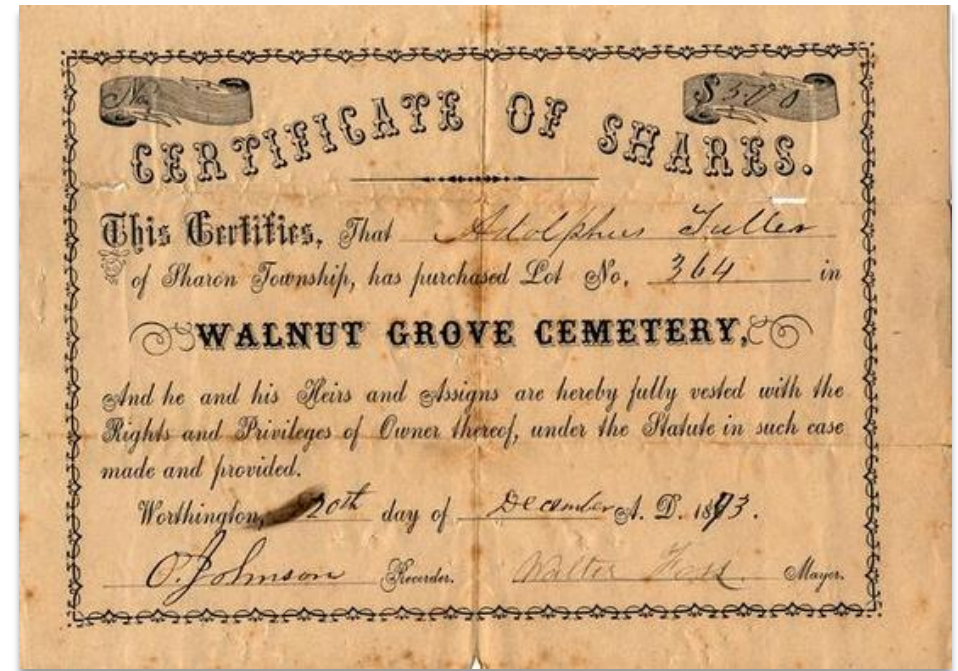

How does it get there?

- Metadata and OAI-PMH
- DPLA does not own or hold rights to items on the site
- Metadata links collection to site and then back to holding institution



Worthington Libraries



More Metadata

- The metadata linked to DPLA is CC0
- Metadata is collected by the Hub and 'harvested' by DPLA on a regular basis

 - Title

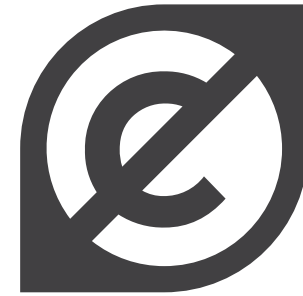
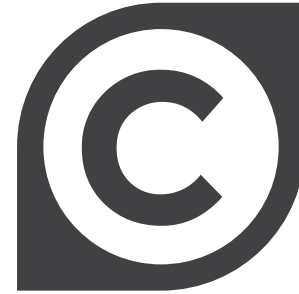

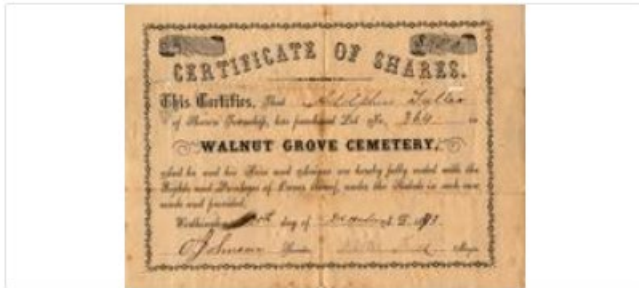
Standardized Rights Statement?
